Ken served for 17 years as the Chief Administrative Officer (CAO) for the Town of LaSalle before deciding to run for Mayor in 2010. He was elected Mayor in 2010 and elected again in 2014. He retired and did not run in the 2018 election. Ken served as the Deputy Warden of Essex County from 2014 to 2018 and served on other committees and boards including the Essex-Windsor Solid Waste Authority. He started his municipal career as a deputy clerk and then clerk before serving as the CAO in Colchester South for five years before taking on the top administrative role in his hometown of LaSalle.
